DRAKE OPENS UP DEFENSE OF MVC TOURNAMENT TITLE AGAINST HOST BRADLEY

WHAT'S AHEAD

Drake travels to Peoria, III., to compete in the six-team State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Men's Soccer Championship as the fourth-seeded Bulldogs battle fifth-seeded and host Bradley on Wednesday (Nov. 10) at 6:00 p.m. at Shea Stadium in the tournament quarterfinals. Avictory over the Braves and Drake advances to face top-seeded Creighton on Friday (Nov. 12) at 6:00 p.m. The tournament quarterfinals and semifinals will be video streamed via MVC TV with the championship match taking place on Sunday (Nov. 14) at 1:06 p.m. with Fox Sports Midwest televising the affair.

SCOUTING THE BRAVES

Bradley (9-8-2) enters tournament play after registering a 2-1 road upset of No. 10 Creighton last Saturday (Nov. 6). Junior Bryan Gaul directs the Braves with team highs in goals (12), points (27), shots on goal (22) and game winners (5), while ranking second in shots (36). Freshman goalkeeper Brian Billings owns the majority of minutes in goal this season, posting a 1.44 goals against average with 65 saves and two shutouts.

SERIES HISTORY

Drake is playing Bradley for the 31st time in school history with the series all square at 14-14-2. The Bulldogs earned a 2-1 road victory over the Braves on Oct. 13. This will mark the sixth encounter in MVC Tournament play with Bradley owning a 4-0-1 series lead. The two teams have not met in the tournament since the semifinals of the 2006 MVC Championship, also on the Braves' home field, which ended in a scoreless draw, but was won by Bradley, 5-3, on penalty kicks.

THE COACHES

Bradley: **Jim DeRose** is in his 15th season leading the Braves' program and maintains a 164-116-30 record (.577).

Drake: In his 13th year on the Drake sidelines as head coach is **Sean Holmes**, who owns a 111-109-26 mark (.504), including 189-135-28 (.577) overall, in his 18th year as a head coach.

DRAKE HEAD COACH SEAN HOLMES

Sean Holmes was named head coach at Drake in 1998 with the program coming off its most successful season in school history in 2009.

During Holmes' 13-year tenure, the Bulldogs have posted a 111-109-26 record, building a legacy of excellence on Drake's campus and in the Missouri Valley Conference.

Drake posted a school-record 16-7-2 mark in 2009, capped off by winning its first ever Missouri Valley Conference Tournament championship while advancing to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

Drake earned its highest ranking in school history, being rated No. 8 in the final 2009 National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Top-25 National Poll. The Bulldogs also rated eighth in the final 2009 NCAA RPI tabulation.

The Bulldogs posted 2009 NCAA Tournament victories past Western Illinois (2-1), No. 13 ranked Ohio State (1-0, overtime) and Boston College (6-4) before falling at nationally ranked North Carolina (2-1).

Garrett Webb was a semi-finalist for the 2009 Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy which is the highest individual honor in college soccer. He also became the second Drake player to earn All-America status with his selection to the NSCAA and College Soccer News second and third team All-America squads, respectively.

A national-best three Bulldogs were named to the 2009 CoSIDA ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America teams, led by senior Brian Wurst, who became the initial first team Academic All-American honoree in school history. Joining him on the second and third teams, respectively, were junior Matt Kuhn and senior Calvin Clark. Drake's three selections marked the most of any school in the country in the university division (Division I), besting Akron and South Carolina, who garnered two selections each.

Drake's progress also has been noticed at the next level, with three players being drafted by Major League Soccer in the last few years. Matt Nickell was selected by the DC United in 2004, while Corey Farabi and Chris Hamburger were both drafted by the Kansas City Wizards in 2005.

Holmes came to Drake after serving as the top assistant at Evansville from 1995-98. During his tenure at Evansville, the Aces compiled a 47-30-6 record, winning the 1996 MVC championship. The team, which he helped build, garnered an NCAA Tournament berth and a top 20 ranking.

Holmes, 45, was born in Switzerland and grew up in Ottawa, Ontario. An all-Ontario sweeper at Carleton University from 1983-87, Holmes was a 1983 Lisgar Collegiate Graduate and a CIAU Men's Soccer Finalist in 1984. Holmes also won the Jack Vogen Award as the school's outstanding senior student-athlete in 1987. He played professionally for the Ottawa Pioneers of the Canadian Soccer League in 1987, and began his coaching career with the University of Kansas soccer club in 1988.

Holmes was head coach at Baker University in Baldwin City, Kan., from 1989-93, compiling a 78-26-2 record, leading the 1991, 1992 and 1993 teams to NAIA District 10 championships. Holmes also served as director of the Olympic Development Program in Kansas for two years.

Holmes holds a USSF 'A' level coaching license and is a member of the Region II staff for the Olympic Development Program. He serves as a staff coach for the Iowa Soccer Association, and also served as age group coach for both the 1978 and 1984 Region II teams. He was an assistant coach at the 1994 U.S. Olympic Sports Festival in St. Louis, Mo.

DRAKE MVC CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

Drake maintains a 6-11-2 mark in 19 matches in MVC Championship history, including 4-6-1 under Sean Holmes. The Bulldogs have posted 0-4-1, 1-5, 3-0 and 1-1-1 marks against Bradley, Creighton, Evansville and Missouri State, respectively. SIU Edwardsville is in its first year of competition in the MVC.

BULLDOG TOURNAMENT NUGGETS

- Drake enters its tournament contest versus Bradley looking for its first-ever tournament win against the Braves. In five previous encounters, Bradley owns a 4-0-1 mark, including a 5-3 shootout victory during the 2006 tournament, also held in Peoria.
- The Bulldogs are 6-11-2 all-time in tournament action, but are 2-0-1 in their last three contests.
- Drake is 3-5-0 all-time in quarterfinal matches, 2-5-2 in the semifinals and 1-1 in championship tilts.
- Drake and Bradley met in the tournament every year between 2002-06, including three times in the quarterfinal round. Against the rest of the field, the Bulldogs own a 5-6-1 tournament ledger.
- Redshirt junior Michael Noonan (Cedar Rapids, Iowa/Xavier) and senior Kenan Malicevic (Cedar Rapids, Iowa/Cedar Valley) are the only two active members on

BULLDOGS CLOSE OUT REGULAR SEASON WITH 2-1 WIN AT EIU

Michael Noonan's goal in the 69th minute (68:58) provided the gamewinning tally in Drake's 2-1 victory over Eastern Illinois last Saturday (Nov. 6).

Drake stole the early momentum in the initial stanza when junior **Michael Thaden** (West Des Moines, Iowa/Valley) netted his fourth goal of the season at the 7:43 mark. Connecting off a free kick, Thaden sent a worm-burner from the top corner of the box through the Eastern Illinois defense to provide the Bulldogs a 1-0 lead.

The margin held until Alex Harrison knotted the affair at one with his third goal of the year at the 43:01 mark.

The Bulldogs held a 5-3 advantage in shots in the first half.

The Panthers statistically controlled the run of play in the final 45 minutes as Eastern Illinois outshot Drake 12-4, to finish the tilt with a 15-9 margin in shots.

Breaking the stalemate was Noonan and the Bulldogs parlayed strong defense into the triumph. The tally was set up by **Thomas Ostrander**, who flicked on a ball with a header from the halfway line by **Nick Foster** into Noonan, who calmly delivered the ball into the open goal.

Redshirt junior **Jordan Kadlec** (Hiawatha, Iowa/Cedar Rapids Kennedy) made two saves for Drake in the first half before giving way to redshirt freshman **Rich Gallagher** (Lake Bluff, III./Lake Forest Academy), who pulled in three stops in the second half en route to notching his first collegiate victory in net.

The final margin was nearly 3-1 but an offside's call at the 58:37 mark disallowed a goal by Ostrander.

Thaden paced Drake with a team-high two shots, while eight other Bulldogs registered one shot.

THREE BULLDOGS GARNER ACADEMIC RECOGNITION

Drake earned recognition for its efforts in the classroom as three Bulldogs were tabbed as first team ESPN Academic All-America All-District VII selections.

Named to the first team to remain in contention for national Academic All-America laurels were **Nick Foster**, **Hunter Kennedy** and **Thomas Ostrander**.

To be nominated, a student-athlete must be a starter or important reserve with at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average (on a 4.0 scale) at his/her current institution. Nominated athletes must have participated in at least 50 percent of the team's games at the position listed on the nomination form (where applicable).

A business major, Foster maintains a 3.52 grade point average. He has started all 17 games for Drake, registering a goal and an assist from his defender's position.

Majoring in health sciences, Kennedy owns a 3.61 GPA. Appearing in all 17 contests for the Bulldogs, including nine starts, Kennedy has collected a goal, while sharing the team lead in assists (3).

An accounting major, Ostrander holds a 3.62 GPA. Playing in all 17 games for Drake, including 16 starts, Ostrander leads the team in goals (5), points (11) and game winners (2), while ranking second in shots (30) and shots on goal (13).

DRAKE HONORS TRIO OF SENIORS

Drake's regular-season home finale against Central Arkansas marked the final home games in the careers of seniors **Nick Foster**, **Evan Harrison** (Evansville, Ind./Reitz Memorial) and **Kenan Malicevic**. Foster has started all 79 games of his Bulldog career and owns two career goals and 10 assists. Harrison has registered three career goals, while adding five assists in 58 contests, which includes 11 starts. Malicevic has totaled 13 career goals and four assists, playing in 63 games, including eight starts.

BULLDOG BITES

- The Bulldogs are in the key month of November and recent history has been on their side as Drake owns an 9-3-2 mark the past two seasons in the month.
- Michael Thaden has emerged this season for the Bulldogs. Recent success has borne this out, as over the last five games he owns team highs in goals (2), assists (1) and points (5).
- Drake has made a habit of playing close games this season as 14 of 17 tilts have been decided by a goal or less, including the last 10. All seven of the Bulldogs' league contests have been decided in the same manner, with three of Drake's four conference wins being of the come-from-behind nature.
- Kenan Malicevic made his return from injury to the Bulldog attack in the second half versus Creighton after a 12-game layoff.
- Drake's game at SIU Edwardsville (Oct. 23) marked the 350th in the head coaching career of Sean Holmes.
- Jordan Kadlec has found himself busy in net this season as his 94 saves rank as the second-best single-season mark in school history.
- Drake saw its 11-match home unbeaten streak dating back to last season come to an end after Creighton posted a 2-1 win on Oct. 20.
- Thomas Ostrander scored a goal in four of Drake's seven home games this season.
- After posting six multi-goal games a season ago, no Bulldog had registered more than one goal in any contest this season until **Michael Thaden** scored the first two goals of his collegiate career in a 2-1 come-from-behind win at Bradley.
- Drake has distributed its scoring efforts this season as nine Bulldogs have recorded a goal this fall.
- Hunter Kennedy's goal at the 13:13 mark of Drake's 3-2 victory over UMKC (Sept. 15) snapped a nearly 310 minute (309:54) scoreless streak for Drake, dating back to **Kenan Malicevic's** second-half goal at Michigan on Sept. 3.
- Jordan Kadlec and Charles Schwartz (Bettendorf, Iowa/Bettendorf) were named to the Mike Berticelli Memorial All-Tournament team.
- The Bulldogs' offense has had to become creative this season in finding ways to score with their opponents holding a decisive shot advantage. Nine Drake players have registered at least one goal and all eight of its victories have been decided by one goal.
- With their six home victories this season, the Bulldogs are 26-6-7 since 2006 in home games, including 13-3-2 the last two campaigns.
- Drake's 1-0 victory at Michigan marked the program's second consecutive 1-0 road shutout against a Big Ten opponent. The Bulldogs garnered a 1-0 overtime victory at Ohio State in the second round of the NCAA Tournament last year. That run came to an end against Indiana as the Hoosiers posted a 2-0 victory. Drake is 3-1-1 in its last five road games versus Big Ten opponents, dating back to the 2007 campaign.
- With his goal at Michigan, Kenan Malicevic is Drake's active leader in career goals with 13.
- After posting eight shutouts a season ago, the Bulldogs opened their 2010 campaign with a shutout, the second of his career for goalkeeper **Jordan Kadlec**.
- Drake posted its third consecutive triumph in a home opener after defeating UMKC, 3-2. The Bulldogs own a 15-10-0 ledger all-time in home lidlifters, including 10-3-0 under Holmes.

IN OUR LAST MEETING

Drake 2, Bradley 1 (Oct. 13, 2010)

PEORIA, ILL. - Picking an opportune time to score his first collegiate goals, **Michael Thaden** netted two tallies over the final 2:56, including the game-winning goal with 29 seconds remaining, to propel Drake to a dramatic 2-1 come-from-behind men's soccer triumph over Bradley.

The two sides fought through a scoreless first half with Bradley owning a 9-4 advantage in shots, including 4-3 on goal. The Bulldogs' best scoring threat in the initial stanza may have come at the 39:26 mark when freshman **Bryan Jantsch** (Mission Hills, Kan./Rockhurst) unfurled a shot that only a team save by a Braves' defender kept Drake off the scoreboard. Aodhan Quinn broke a scoreless stalemate in favor of Bradley, punching through a ball in the midst of a scrum in the 56th minute (55:50) to give the Braves a 1-0 lead.

It appeared Bradley had garnered a 2-0 advantage in the 85th minute, but Bryan Gaul's insurance tally was waved off by an offside call.

The advantage held until the 87:04 mark when Thaden and Braves' goalkeeper Brian Billings collided racing for a through ball on the right side of the penalty area. Bradley was charged with a foul in the box and Thaden made the Braves pay converting a penalty kick to square the contest at one. The goal was both the first of the season and of the career for Thaden.

With Drake still aggressive with the clock counting down the final minute of regulation, Bradley was unable to cleanly clear the ball out of its penalty area. **Michael Noonan** collected the ball on the right side and played it back to the top of the box, where Thaden ripped a shot that deflected off another player and sailed into the back netting to complete a closing rally.

The match proved to be physical in nature as 23 combined fouls were whistled, including 14 against the Braves.

Bradley outshot the Bulldogs in the affair, 18-12, including 9-8 in the second half.

Thaden directed Drake with a team-high three shots, while **Nick Foster** and **Charles Schwartz** each added two shots. **Jordan Kadlec** pulled in four saves for the Bulldogs.

NATIONALLY SPEAKING

The Bulldogs are 47th in the NCAA in save percentage (.813). Individually, **Jordan Kadlec** is ninth and 56th nationally in saves per game (5.53) and save percentage (.803).

BULLDOGS SIXTH IN NSCAA MIDWEST REGION POLL

Drake is ranked sixth in the Midwest Region poll as released by the NSCAA on Nov. 9. SMU is the regional leader, followed by Creighton, Tulsa, UAB, SIU Edwardsville, Drake, Kentucky, UMKC, Missouri State and Bradley.

OVER OUR LAST FIVE GAMES

The Bulldogs own a 2-2-1 mark in their last five contests, with three of the five occurring away from home. Five Drake players have registered a goal, with **Michael Thaden** leading the way with two goals. Thaden leads the team in scoring in that span with five points, while **Charles Schwartz** paces the squad in shots (11). **Jordan Kadlec** has been peppered by 70 shots in that span in goal and has recorded 24 saves.

WINS VERSUS LOSSES

In their eight victories, the Bulldogs are registering 14.9 shots, 7.6 corner kicks and 5.1 saves, while their opponents are recording 15.8 shots, 4.5 corner kicks and 4.8 saves. In its seven losses, Drake is averaging 8.6 shots, 3.6 corner kicks and 6.1 saves, while surrendering 21.0 shots, 8.7 corner kicks and 2.9 saves.

THADEN/KADLEC SWEEP MVC MEN'S SOCCER AWARDS

Michael Thaden and **Jordan Kadlec** were selected as the league's Men's Soccer Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week (Oct. 18), respectively. It marked the second time this season that Kadlec has been honored, while Thaden garnered recognition for the first time.

Thaden was instrumental in helping Drake post a 1-0-1 mark in a pair of league road contests. In two games, he registered team highs in goals (2), assists (1), points (5), shots (5), shots on goal (3) and game winners (1).

In the Bulldogs' come-from-behind 2-1 victory at Bradley (Oct. 13), Thaden nearly single-handedly led Drake to victory scoring a pair of goals in the game's final three minutes. His tally in the 88th minute (87:04) squared the contest at one and represented his first career goal. Then with only 29 seconds left in regulation he scored the game-winning tally to give the Bulldogs the win.

In a 1-1 double-overtime tie at Missouri State, Thaden collected two shots, while assisting on **Thomas Ostrander's** goal.

Kadlec crafted a solid week for the Bulldogs in net in sparking Drake to a 1-0-1 record ,pulling in nine saves, while owning a 0.90 goals against average.

In the Bulldogs' dramatic 2-1 triumph at Bradley (Oct. 13), he collected four saves. He followed with a five-save performance in Drake's 1-1 double-overtime tie at Missouri State.

OSTRANDER/KADLEC SWEEP WEEKLY MVC AWARDS

Thomas Ostrander and Jordan Kadlec were named the league's Men's Soccer Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week (Oct. 4), respectively. It marked the second time this season that Ostrander has been honored, while Kadlec garnered recognition for the first time.

Kadlec turned in a stellar week for the Bulldogs in helping Drake to a 1-0-1 mark, including a 1-1 double-overtime tie versus No. 9/12 UC Irvine (Oct. 2).

In Drake's 3-2 victory over Western Illinois (Sept. 28), a 2009 NCAA Tournament participant, he pulled in four saves.

He followed with a career performance against UC Irvine, also a 2009 NCAA Tournament participant, matching a career high with nine saves in holding the nation's seventh-best offensive unit to only one goal in 110 minutes. Midway through the second overtime he received a laceration to the forehead in a collision in the box with an Anteater player and remained down for several minutes. He returned to his feet and refused to come out of the game en route to finishing off the Bulldogs' top result of the season.

İn Drake's 3-2 victory over Western Illinois, Ostrander posted a game-high five shots and connected on the game-winning goal with just 46 seconds left in regulation (89:14) to give the Bulldogs a dramatic win.

He followed by registering Drake's only goal in a 1-1 tie against UC Irvine. The Anteaters had come into the game having allowed only two goals all season and none in a game that they didn't record the victory. The tally off a Drake corner kick came just over two minutes after UC Irvine took a 1-0 lead and secured what proved to be a key 1-1 draw against the Anteaters.

KADLEC NAMED TO COLLEGE SOCCER NEWS NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK

Jordan Kadlec was named to the College Soccer News National Team of the Week for the period ending Oct. 3.

THE TIME TO SHINE

The change of seasons has boded well for Drake over the years as the flipping of the calendar from September to October has ignited the Bulldogs into some of their best soccer of the season. In Drake's last seven seasons, including the 2010 campaign, under head coach **Sean Holmes**, the Bulldogs own a 25-14-8 record (.617) and have posted seven consecutive winning October's.

CRALL NAMED TO TOPDRAWERSOCCER.COM COLLEGE PLAYERS TO WATCH FRESHMEN TOP 100 MEN LIST

Drake freshman **Garrett Crall** (Norwalk, Iowa/Norwalk) has been tabbed by *TopDrawerSoccer.com* as one of its College Players To Watch Freshmen Top 100 Men.

Crall is the second highest-rated freshman in the Missouri Valley Conference coming in at No. 51 in the rankings.

Named as Iowa's Mr. Soccer as a senior after leading Norwalk High School to a berth in the state quarterfinals, he earned first team all-state and all-conference accolades as well as being tabbed a second team academic all-state selection in 2010.

At Drake, Crall has started all 17 games for the Bulldogs and owns the game-winning goal in Drake's 3-2 victory over Loyola (Sept. 18).

OSTRANDER NAMED MVC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Thomas Ostrander was honored as the MVC Offensive Men's Soccer Player of the Week Sept. 20. The accolade marked the first occasion this season a Drake player has been recognized with weekly conference laurels and the second time in his career that the Ostrander has captured the top offensive award.

Ostrander was instrumental in helping the Bulldogs to a 2-0 mark against UMKC and Loyola, registering a team-high two goals.

His tally in the 80th minute (79:59) on a half-bicycle kick against UMKC (Sept. 15) lifted Drake to a dramatic 3-2 victory over the Kangaroos. The goal was the first of the season for Ostrander.

He followed with a breakaway goal in the 16th minute (15:12) in Drake's 3-2 win over Loyola (Sept. 18), while pacing the Bulldogs with a team-high two shots.

DRAKE NO. 14 IN PRESEASON NSCAA NATIONAL POLL

Drake garnered the program's first-ever National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) preseason national top-25 ranking as the Bulldogs off a school-record 16-7-2 mark a season ago checked in at No. 14 when the poll was released on Aug. 10.

After advancing to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament a year ago, the Bulldogs ranked No. 8 in the final 2009 NSCAA poll, the best finish in program history. Drake was the lone Missouri Valley Conference representative in the top-25 and two of its 2010 opponents, Indiana and UC Irvine, join the Bulldogs in the preseason tabulation at No. 20 and No. 25, respectively.

BULLDOGS NO. 16 IN TOPDRAWERSOCCER.COM PRESEASON TOURNAMENT 48 POLL

The Bulldogs added another national ranking to their arsenal on Aug. 23 as *TopDrawerSoccer.com* tabbed the Bulldogs No. 16 in its preseason Tournament 48 of the teams it projects to make the 2010 NCAA Tournament.

Drake was one of two Missouri Valley Conference representatives in the Tournament 48, joining Creighton, who checks in at No. 40. Six of the Bulldogs' 2010 opponents were in the poll, led by No. 20 Indiana. Also ranked were No. 24 Notre Dame, No. 31 Saint Louis, No. 35 Michigan, Creighton and No. 47 Western Illinois.

BULLDOGS PICKED FOURTH IN MVC RACE WITH KUHN GARNERING PRESEASON HONORS

The Missouri Valley Conference released its 2010 Preseason Men's Soccer Coaches' Poll on Aug. 17 and the nationally-ranked Drake program was tabbed to finish fourth, while placing **Matt Kuhn** on the preseason All-MVC squad.

The Bulldogs, who return five starters from a squad that posted a school-record 16-7-2 mark a year ago en route to reaching the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament, garnered 41 points.

Pegged ahead of the Bulldogs were Creighton (49 points), Missouri State (52 points and two first-place votes) and Evansville, which was selected as the preseason favorite to win the league crown with 60 points and six first-place tallies. Rounding out the poll were Bradley (28 points), SIU Edwardsville (24 points), Eastern Illinois (20 points) and Central Arkansas (14 points).

Kuhń was among 11 players named by a vote of the eight MVC head men's soccer coaches to the All-MVC Preseason team




